## February 2024 A Knock at Midnight: A Story of Hope, Justice and Freedom by Brittany K. Barnett

Brittany K Barnett was a law student when she came across the case that would change her life forever – that of Sharanda Jones, single mother businessowner, and like her, Black daughter of the rural south. A victim of America's war on drug. Sharanda had been separated from her young daughter and was serving a life sentence without parole for a first- time drug offense. As Barnett studied the case, a system came into focus with widespread racial injustice at thee core of America's addiction to incarceration. Moved, Barnett set to work to gain Sharanda's freedom. The memoir is at once Barnett's coming-of-age story and a powerful evolution of what it takes to bring hope and justice to a system built to resist them.

## March 2024 Together: The Healing Power of Human Connection in a Sometimes Lonely World by Vivek H Murthy

In this ground breaking book, the 19<sup>th</sup> surgeon general of the United State Dr. Vivek Murthy makes a case for loneliness as a public health concern: a root cause and contributor to many of the epidemics sweeping the world today- from alcohol and drug addiction to violence to depression and anxiety. Loneliness, he argues, is affecting not only our health, but also how our children experience school, how we perform in the workplace, and the sense of division and polarization in our society. His message underscores the importance of human connection, the hidden impact of loneliness on our health, and the social power of community.



## **Committee on Nominations**

You might be a United Woman in Faith if you have been the President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer in your unit. Unit offices are often held by the same women year after year or women rotate from one office to another. When an officer resigns it is often a struggle to find someone to fill that position. It is the job of the Committee on Nomination to recruit the candidate and not the outgoing officer or other officers responsibility. Many of the units do not have a Committee on Nomination so the leadership team does not change and grow. Every member of a unit should fill out a talent bank form. From the form the committee gets to know a person's ability, interest, strengths and weakness. The form is not a commitment to hold an office, but it helps the Committee on Nominations match a person to a position that would be a perfect fit. These forms also help the unit to suggest women who the District Committee on Nomination should reach out to about holding a district office. You do not have to have held a unit office to serve as an East Central District officer.

East Central district is one of the strongest districts in Florida with a full slate of officers for 2024.

Our elected officers that make up the executive committee are:

- Janet Blume is in her second year as President, she previously served as the District Secretary for three years and Education &Interpretation for two years.
- Paula Foley is the Vice President, the first time we have had this position filled in 6
  years. She will support Janet especially doing program planning.
- Maryann Mueller has been the Treasurer for past two years and helps all the unit treasurers.
- Linda Welander began as Secretary last year. She was the Education & Interpretation
   Coordinator before taking the secretary position. She helped plan the District Mission U program.
- The Committee on Nomination chair is Tracey Perry, she has served faithfully on this committee for the past three years. Dottie Mathias (previous chair), Live Kotkin, and Julie Weed serve on this committee. There should be at least 5 members so this in one area we need your help to get filled.



## **Committee on Nominations**

### Appointed offices on the leadership team are:

- The Secretary of Program resources was recently vacated. This office helps promote all the books in the United Women in Faith reading program and all of the program material.
- Diane Abresky is the Communication Coordinator, without her you may not been reading the Trumpet Sound.
- Gillian Wolfe has been our Social Action coordinator, for the past four years she has kept us aware and motivated with all the issues United Women in Faith help to bring about change.
- Phoebe Lustre and Doris Hatfield co-lead Membership, Nurture and Outreach. Our membership and all the ways units work are what makes our district strong.
- Lynn Campbell is the Parliamentarian. She was an East District President from 2012 to 2015.

There is one coordinator position that is vacant, Education & Interpretation If the Mission Study is your passion, let the Committee on Nomination know you may like to fill this office.

A district officer is elected or appointed to a position for a two year term. They can serve in that position for four years, except for treasurer and who can serve for six years. A district officer can only serve for a total of eight year.

Let's keep the East Central District United Women in Faith strong and healthy. Fill out your talent bank form and agree to hold an office. The district Committee on Nomination needs you so we will have a full slate of officers in 2025 and years to come.
