Being Seen

In an article on mentoring, Hannah Schell explains that mentors need to support, challenge, and inspire, but "first, and perhaps foremost, a good mentor "sees you". Recognition, not in terms of awards or publicity but in the sense of simply 'being seen,' is a basic human need." People need to be recognized, known, and believed in.

In a reading in the Daily Bread there was a devotion by Julie Schwab on the importance of being seen and how we can support and encourage others.



April - THE PRODIGAL PROPHET: JONAH AND THE MYSTERY OF GOD'S MERCY TIMO-THY KELLER

The story of Jonah is one of the most well-known but most misunderstood parables in the Bible. In The Prodigal Prophet, pastor and New York Times bestselling author Timothy Keller reveals the hidden depths within the book of Jonah. Keller makes the case that Jonah was one of the worst prophets in the entire Bible. And yet there are unmistakably clear connections between Jonah, the prodigal son, and Jesus. Tasmin can't accept losing her brother to some magician-prophet. She decides to follow the Nazarene's group, do whatever she must to mend the fractured relationship with her brother, and bring him home.

June - UNTIL UNITY REV. FRANCIS CHAN DAVID C COOK

If unity is so important to the heart of God, why is the church one of the most divided groups on earth? New York Times bestselling author Francis Chan calls for believers and churches everywhere to align hearts with God and start taking seriously God's numerous commands to unify. We also had a poster board displaying many women who were trailblazers in history, and on whose shoulders we now stand. We shared our experiences of women in our lives who have been role models for us.


A Praise Dance Ministry was also performed by one of our UWFaith member.
